

Army Act, 1950

Section 83 - Punishment of Officers, Junior Commissioned Officers and Warrant Officers by Brigade Commanders and Others

An officer having power not less than a brigade, or an equivalent commander or such other officer as is, with the consent of the Central Government specified by¹[the Chief of the Army Staff] may, in the prescribed manner, proceed against an officer below the rank of a field officer, a junior commissioned officer or a warrant officer, who is charged with an offence under this Act, and award one or more of the following punishments, that is to say,--

(a) severe reprimand or reprimand;

(b) stoppage of pay and allowances until any proved loss or damage occasioned by the offence of which he is convicted is made good.
